



#### Prevention

We can stop the harm of drug use by supporting people as early as possible.

FACT: We're beloing people keep their opioid prescriptions safe and promoting alternatives to opioid pain medications.



#### Rescue

Everyone can learn how to use Naxolone and carry it with them to help stop an opioid overdose.

FACT: We have community trainings every month for anyone who wants to learn how to use Nalescone.



#### **Treatment**

Anyone who is ready for treatment can get help when they are ready.

FACT: BH Link is a 24-boor crisis center and support line where anyone can get help.



### Recovery

We know that recovery from addiction is possible for everyone

FACT: We have more recovery support services than ever in our state. "This is the biggest public health crisis our state has ever seen.

#### Preventing opioid overdoses


When a person survives an overdose, it's because someone knew what an overdose looked like and how to take action. Call 9-1-1 immediately if you think someone is overdosing.

Back-end enhancements to improve timeliness and consistency of data. To save lives, we need to educate everyone about the dangers of overdose and end the stigma of addiction.



### **Overview**

- Incorporating the state's workforce development program, Real Jobs Rhode Island and it's 44 sector partnerships
- Leveraging public health expertise through partnerships with the Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH) and Rhode Island Department of Behavioral Health, Developmental Disabilities and Hospitals (BHDDH)
- Integrating Institutes of Higher Education and Apprenticeship RI to leverage and adopt innovative means to ensure Rhode Island has a robust number of health workers trained in various occupations to address the opioid crisis.



### Goals

Address the need for healthcare professionals to respond to the opioid crisis.

Provide addiction/opioid education and services for workers/workforce.

Provide career and training services for crisisimpacted residents to enter or re-enter the workforce.



# Goal 1: Address the Need for Healthcare Professionals to Respond to the Opioid Crisis.

- Provide Peer Recovery
   Specialists (PRS) with a

- Expand the Registered Apprenticeship (RA) model for Community Health Workers (CHWs).

### Drug Overdose Prevention Mini-Grant Requirements



- Status as a non-profit, community-based organization.
- Experience providing services and support to high-risk populations.
- Based on findings from the Spring 2018 Report:
   Multidisciplinary Review of Drug Overdose Death
   Evaluation (MODE) Team or the February 2019 Report:
   Rhode Island Review of Overdose Accidental Deaths
   (ROAD).
- Completion of proposed mini-grant project within three months of approval or Purchase Order receipt.


### Mini-Grant Highlights: Prevention



 The home visiting model was successful in improving refugees' knowledge of safe medication storage.



 The in-person outreach to daycare centers was helpful for raising awareness of support resources for grandparents.



 Local businesses/employers requested improvements to educational materials and access to a centralized toolkit.

# Mini-Grant Highlights: Harm Reduction

 Naloxone administration education to high-risk populations reduces overdose deaths and saves lives.

 Older Rhode Islanders felt moderate to highconfidence using a NaloxBox following naloxone administration and recognition training.

 Use of fentanyl test strip kits may help influence a person's decision-making and drug-use behaviors.

### Mini-Grant Highlights: Treatment



- The Safe Stations model is expanding across Rhode Island, providing linkage to treatment and support for people with Substance Use Disorder (SUD).
- An online toolkit is being developed to help treatment providers address their patients' social determinants of health.

 Implementation of an evidence-based practice intervention, such as Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), is a feasible project within a short time frame.

### Next Steps



- A new round of mini-grant funding will be announced in early 2020.
- Grantees will have greater flexibility with project design.
- Time-frame for project implementation will be extended beyond the three-month period.
